### **Manna Made Manifest Bags**

Buy or have your church group collect the following items. Each week a different item can be brought to church and placed in a donation basket. When everything is collected, have a "work day" where everyone places the items in each zip-lock gallon bag. As you encounter someone in need along the freeway, near your house or at work, smile and hand them a MANNA BAG.



- 1 gallon size Zip-lock bag
- 2 granola bars
- 1 toothbrush
- 1 small tube of toothpaste
- 1-2 packages of raisins or dried fruit
- 1-2 packages of Tuna with crackers
- 1 bottle of water
- 1 wash cloth
- Travel size—soap, shampoo and rinse
- Add an Upper Room or pocket Bible
- Invitation to your church!

Keep in your car ready for your first opportunity to help.

## Sewing Projects

The following projects are requested around the world for people in need. Some will go with UMCOR and some with our mission teams. Make them and use them in your own community to help others.

Patterns available through our Sewing Ministry.

### Baby gown or shirt—



Simple gowns for newborns which become shirts when only half the pattern is used. Colorful remnants can be used and the sewing is very easy. Ties in the back so no snaps or buttons. These are sent out by UMCOR to disaster areas.

### Child's School Bag— This very simple pattern is used not only for



our own Mission projects in Mexico to help children with school preparation, but are sent all over the world. The pattern is very basic and can be sewn in just minutes.

## School Pack Program

These packs are distributed among needy families on the border of South Texas and Mexico. Place all items in purchased or hand made back pack. Estimated cost of School Pack: \$20

- Pack of (10) pencils
- 2 Ball point pens
- 1 calculator
- 1 ruler
- 1 eraser
- 1 pencil sharpener (plastic)
- 1-8 oz. bottle of school glue
- 5-Single subject spiral notebooks
- Pack of (12) colored pencils
- 1 Back pack

In addition to the school packs, the children in Mexico are in need of school uniforms. \$30 will purchase (2) uniforms for a child.

## Sewing Kits

- 3 yards of cotton or cotton-blend— solid color or print fabric
- 1 pair of sewing scissors
- 1 package of needles
- 1 spool of thread
- 6 matching buttons

Wrap sewing materials in the fabric and tie with a string or strip of cloth. Place items in a 1 gallon zip lock bag.

## Health Kits

### National and International UMCOR Disaster Areas

1 Hand towel

1 Wash cloth

1 Hair comb, regular size (not pocket)

1 Nail file or finger nail clipper

1 Bath size bar of soap in original wrapper

1 Toothbrush in original sealed package

6 Adhesive bandages (such as band-aids)

## Cleaning Bucket UMCOR KIT

Each family should have one bucket for themselves and one to Give Away!

5-gallon bucket with reseal able lid

Bleach (two 1-quart or one 82 oz. bottle).

5 scouring pads

1 scrub brush

18 cleaning towels (easy-wipes)

7 sponges

Liquid laundry detergent (two 25 oz. or one 50 oz. bottle)

1 household cleaner, 12-16 oz. bottle

Disinfectant dish soap, 16-28 oz. bottle

50 clothes pins

Clothes line (two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.)

5 dust masks

2 pair latex gloves

1 pair work gloves

24-bag roll heavy-duty trash bags, 33-45 gallon (remove from box)

1 insect repellent spray, 6-14 oz. can

1 air freshener, 8 or 9 oz. can

All bottles should be plastic. Send new, un-opened items inside bucket and seal the lid. Do not include bleach if shipping.
